Analytical skills (A1-A4)

1. **Critique** the sources, methods and choices underpinning the collection and presentation of social scientific evidence.
2. **Analyse** quantitative and qualitative data using a range of methods and tools.
3. **Construct** and **communicate** persuasive, evidence-based arguments in written, oral and visual formats.
4. **Recognise** and **evaluate** the historical contexts/origins of social scientific ideas, principles, methods, and tools.

Interdisciplinary thinking (I1-I3)

5. **Identify** and **critically assess** causal claims in social scientific explanations.
6. **Interrogate** the demarcation of social science disciplines.
7. **Investigate** complex social issues, integrating insights from across a range of disciplines and methodological approaches.

Leadership and teamworking skills (LT1-LT2)

8. **Design** and **manage** a collaborative project, working effectively as part of a diverse team.
9. **Collaborate** with peers to build consensus and accomplish shared goals.
