- As a student from another University of London college, you can register as an intercollegiate student at LSE if you meet the following criteria:
 - You are currently registered on a University of London degree and the course you wish to follow at LSE will form part of your degree programme. Visiting students (for example, students in their Junior Year Abroad) are not eligible for intercollegiate registration.
 - You have been given permission by the appropriate LSE authority (Section 4).
 - You have been given permission by the appropriate authority at your home college (Section 6). By approving this registration, your home university agrees to pay the fee for the course as specified by LSE (see point 6 below). You do not pay LSE directly.
- You will be required to register at LSE for each academic year you attend the School as an intercollegiate student.
- Your intercollegiate registration at the School is conditional upon satisfactory academic performance and compliance with the School's Regulations. By agreeing to the Conditions of Registration, you also agree to notify LSE if you permanently withdraw from your home institution, or take a break in your studies.
- If you change your course after submitting this form, you must complete a new form (clearly marked "AMENDMENT") and submit it to the LSE Student Services Centre immediately, and no later than the third week of the term in which your course is taught.
