Economic History (EH courses)

All Economic History courses are controlled access and capped. Priority will be given to students for whom the course is within their programme regulations. Places will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis with first round offers being sent by **Thursday**23rd September. Students wishing to take an Economic History course as an outside option will be waitlisted initially and will be informed by **Monday 27**th September whether they have been successful.

Once an offer has been sent, you have 48 hours to accept it before it times out. Once an offer has timed out, it will be re-allocated to someone on the waitlist.
