As teachers and researchers at the world's leading social science institution, you play an important and highly valued role in the life of the School and in the way our students are educated. LSE's Atlas programme of events and workshops is designed to facilitate that role through:

- Development workshops: Regular academic development workshops on topics such as assessment diversification, peer study, digital education, inclusive pedagogies, etc.
- Communities of practice: Sessions where a group with a common interest or role meets on a termly basis to discuss emerging issues as identified by them such as the Simulation special interest group (SIMSIG) and the Education Career Track Network (ECTN).
- Teaching cafes: Events that include speakers from the LSE or outside who discuss and share examples of their practice.
- Bespoke workshops: Atlas workshops that can be tailored to specific departmental needs. Bespoke opportunities for academic development can be arranged through contacting your departmental adviser.
