- Engage in the activities and discussions within the Hall-Carpenter Room in a spirit of cooperation. While
 maintaining your personal beliefs and identities, also embrace the opportunity to build positive relationships
 with others.
- Address conflicts or tensions openly, aiming for resolution and understanding through positive communication.

3. Privacy and Mindfulness

- Respect the rights and privacy of others, and refrain from discussing the identity or beliefs of others outside of the space. This preserves the neutrality of the space for all visitors.
- Recognise and respect the solemnity of activities that may take place in the Hall-Carpenter Room.

4. Collaborative Atmosphere

- Participate in the life of the Hall-Carpenter Room by attending informal gatherings, discussions, and initiatives that promote inclusivity and intersectionality.
- After using the space, leave it in the same condition you found it, ready for the next group to utilise. This shared responsibility helps maintain the space's welcoming environment.

5. Accessibility

- Utilise the existing furniture and features of the space, which is configured to ensure accessibility.
- Only modify the layout of the furniture if you have strong justification for doing so; and declare your intention and reason to add, remove or move furniture when booking the space.

6. Acknowledgment and Accountability

- Honour the decisions made by the Hall-Carpenter Room staff regarding room bookings and other related matters. These decisions are intended to ensure fairness and equal access to the space.
- Holding ourselves accountable and behaving consistently with this code is essential for upholding the space's
 respectful atmosphere; we may need to review rights and privileges of access to the Hall-Carpenter Room if
 these guidelines are not adhered to.
