*Originally quite unattractive space on the ground floor of King's Chambers with shop front type windows was transformed to provide a stylish, clean and functional students' space to spend free time between lectures, relax and meet their peers.*

*The owner of the design concept is Ailin Huang, LSE's student who submitted her ideas as part of the design competition for the new Student Salon.*

*The design incorporates new faceted timber wall lining with coloured recesses for custom made benches, desks as well as ornately framed shelves, power & data points, fire alarm panels and signage.*

*The mirrored panels applied to ceiling and walls add a dramatic effect flooding the space with natural light. A central desk and pull out seats were custom made to accommodate hot-desking students. The bench at the rear of the room is the perfect place for a little bit of inter-disciplinary fraternisation.*
