
This newsletter outlines works to be undertaken in the Old Building for the refurbishment of Level 1 – 6 and the electrification project.

This includes information on the measures being taken to reduce the impact of the forthcoming service shutdown works.


#### Refurbishment

Refurbishment



# Old Building Refurbishment & Electrification




The academic departments Anthropology, Sociology and Social Policy are to be accommodated across levels; 2, M2, 3, M3, 4, 5 & 6

The existing quality of space across these levels is vastly inconsistent, owing to the piecemeal way the building has been maintained over its long history. Some elements that have been developed recently are of good quality and worthy of retention whereas others are worn, dated and in need of modernisation. The key dates of the programme can be found below:

## **Electrification - Work Phases, Service Shutdowns and Planned Disruption**

The electrification project has been developed to create a cleaner low carbon operation for heating the building. The project includes state of the art heat pump technology that will achieve a 70% reduction in carbon emissions for the building. Mechanically ventilated heat recovery units are be installed to reduce heat losses. Replacement of artificial lighting: 75% of existing lighting to be replaced by highly efficient lighting with built-in occupancy and daylight controls.

At times there will be a requirement for services to be shutdown. Advance notice of these will be communicated in advance to building users via departmental administrators and staff and student news.
