FAULKNERBROWNS' VISION FOR DURHAM IMPRESSES


FaulknerBrowns Architects submits plans for the redevelopment of a major riverside site in Durham. Planners give the £150 million scheme the OK in the autumn



EDINBURGH PFI SCHOOLS FIASCO


