### Environmental Update

We are committed to delivering sustainable solutions throughout the construction of the Marshall Building. Below we outline some of the key environmental achievements of the project so far:

• 100% of all timber used on site has had FSC certification and 100% of all key materials have been responsibly sourced.

• Almost 20 tonnes of timber waste has been reused through the social enterprise community wood recycling.

• Continue to meet over 98% diversion of waste from landfill

• 100% responsible sourcing of key materials including timber, concrete, steel, brick and blockwork,

• Progressing the BREEAM certification as we head towards handover

• 100% renewable electricity on site and a number of hybrid MEWPS are being used to reduce air quality impacts across the site

### Site progress

Since the last update construction of the Marshall Building continues to make good progress. We are pleased to report that we have now removed Tower Crane 1 from the north elevation of the building.

Internal Fit out works are progressing well and commissioning works on Level 9 - 3. Drylining lining and specialist joinery works to Level 1 & 2 with Terrazzo install on the Ground Floor progressing well.

Building 1 & Building 2 fit out works progressing to toilets, sports hall and associated teaching rooms.

We are planning the following works over the coming months:

- 1. Installation of Pre cast cladding
- 2. Fit out and snagging works progressing all areas
- 3. Underfloor clean and Mechanical &Electrical snagging
- 4. Commissioning works progressing
- 5. GF Terrazzo works to all areas
- 6. Tower Crane 1 Removal June 21
- 7. External Hard & Soft Landscaping to roof Terraces
