## Site update

We are pleased to report that the construction works on the Marshall Building are progressing well.

Since our last update we have completed the intermediate slab (B1) and the walls and columns have reached ground level.

We have removed the large steel props as the permanent works start to replace temporary works.

Over the next two months you will start to observe the building rising above the site hoarding. During this time we will continue to progress works to the ground floor slabs.

We will also start casting the concrete trees (featured above) on site. These trees are a key architectural feature that will create a cathedral like space at the entrance of the building.

We are required to use a concrete pump to progress with this phase of construction.

Due to the nature of these works and the equipment involved, you may notice some noise emitted from the site.

These works are absolutely necessary for the success of this project, however, you will be pleased to know that these works are not continuous and we will be monitoring noise, dust and vibration regularly in order to minimise the effects of these works on our site neighbours.

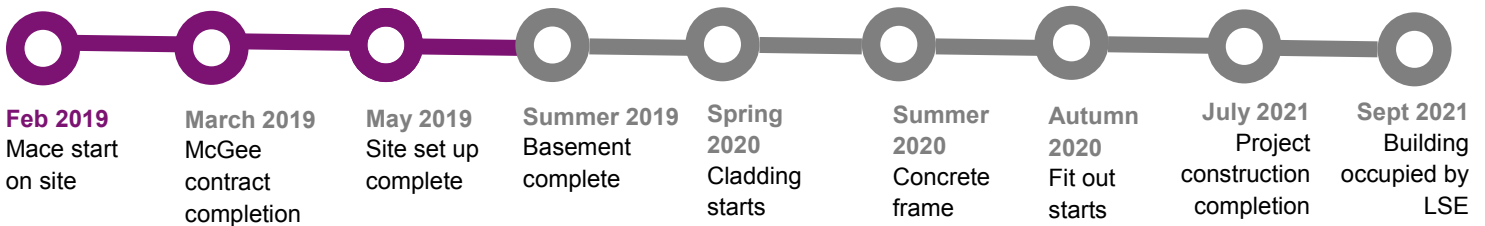
