## Site progress

We are committed to delivering sustainable solutions throughout the construction of the Marshall Building. Below we outline some of the key environmental achievements of the project so far:

As we draw towards the end of construction we are focussing on the delivery of our Green Building certification through collecting evidence so that the credits can be awarded. The project has a good level of diversion of waste from landfill (98.65% in June) and responsible sourcing of materials (100% certified in June). The soft landscaping on site is beneficial for enhancing biodiversity in the long run and improving wellbeing.

Since the last update construction of the Marshall Building continues to make good progress. We are pleased to report that we have now removed both tower cranes

Internal Fit out works are progressing well and commissioning works on Level 9 – 3. Drylining lining and specialist joinery works to Level 1 & 2 with specialist acoustic render install to GF soffits.

B1 & B2 fit out works progressing to WC's, sports hall and associated facilities.

“To remember our colleague Chris and support Mates in Mind the site team participated in fund raising events with street foods and ‘sponge’ throwing”



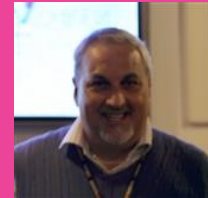

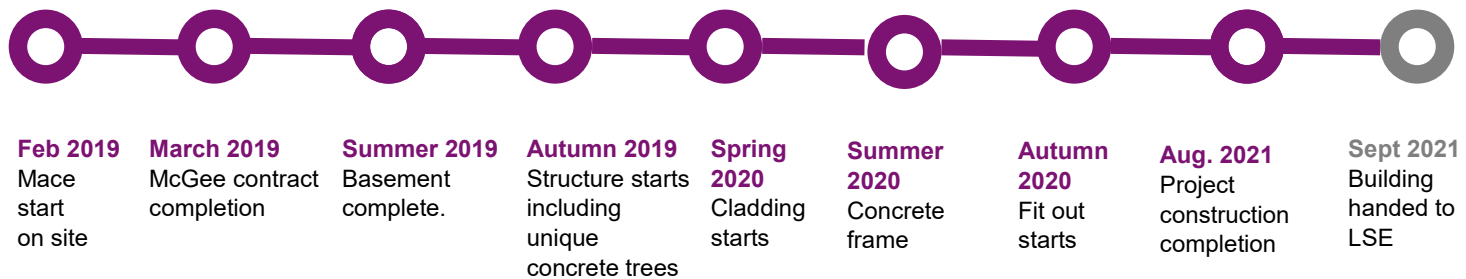
