## **Progress Update**

Wates Construction Ltd would like to take this opportunity to update you on our progress over the last month and key project milestones at the Royal College of Surgeons

Happy New Year, and welcome to the third edition of our monthly newsletter.

Following our last newsletter, I'm pleased to inform you that we continue to make good progress achieving our key programme milestones at the Royal College of Surgeons (RCS). Most noticeable of these will be the formation of the demolition opening to Portugal Street and WCL Phase 2 accommodation block located in the Barry forecourt to Lincoln's Inn Fields. Works that maybe less noticeable, but equally important to the redevelopment works:-

- Complete drainage and enabling works to the Barry building forecourt
- · Commenced structural demolition works
- · Continued asbestos removal to lower levels of the building
- · Continued environmental monitoring to the existing building
- Continued soft-strip demolition to lower levels of the building

Project Description:

The Royal College of Surgeons has identified that it's current building arrangements and layout are no longer capable of meeting its needs. Consequently the RCS will consolidate its activities within a refurbished and partially re-developed Barry Building. This will enable the building to meet member aspirations for the 21st Century.

The proposals include the partial demolition and redevelopment of the Royal College of Surgeons Barry building (39-43 Lincoln's Inn Fields) to provide new accommodation for the RCS (Class D1).

The original front range, including the library spaces and the Lincoln's Inn Fields façade, will be retained and refurbished with improved landscaping to the forecourt

All building services will be stripped out and renewed. The opportunity will be taken to improve the thermal performances of the building. Modern plant and equipment will be installed. New passenger lifts will be fitted in a core to the side of a broadly central atrium.

The post-war rear portion of the building will be demolished and redeveloped, with two basement levels, including education and conservation areas: the Hunterian museum, a temporary exhibition space and associated education space will occupy the majority of the ground floor, including a public café; examination suites occupy the first floor level alongside the retained library rooms; four floors of open plan RCS office space are above; and a conference suite, with associated catering, will be located on the sixth floor level. All floors from the ground floor upwards are orientated around the large central atrium.

# **Upcoming Works**

## Key Project Milestone

Structural demolition has commenced at the Royal College of Surgeons.

#### Key activities:

- · Complete removal of asbestos material
- · Continued soft strip demolition
- · Continued structural demolition to upper levels of the building
- · Complete removal and storage of salvage items
- Erection of demolition scaffolding along the boundary between the Royal College of Surgeons and 44 Lincoln's Inn Fields
- Installation of temporary works to the existing Barry building
- Relocation of demolition plant and removal of bulk demolition material on the 20<sup>th</sup> of January and 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2018 from a mobile crane sited on Lincoln's Inn Fields. (See details below)



### Partial Road Closure to Portugal Street:

On the 20<sup>th</sup> January and the 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2018 we will be relocating demolition plant and removing demolition materials for structural demolition works. To facilitate this the road on Portugal Street will be reduced to a single lane carriageway between the hours of 07:00 through to 18:00.

As indicated in Fig 6 and Fig 7 the mobile crane will be positioned on Portugal Street directly outside the RCS.




Fig 07 - Position of the mobile crane on Portugal Street




Fig 08 - Position of mobile crane on Portugal Street






Fig 11 HGV lorry
